# Ceramics - 1

#### **About the Course**

### **Course Description**

This course is designed for students who have an interest in working with clay. Students will gain experiences in producing functional as well as sculptural pieces, while using a variety of techniques to produce each piece of work. Throughout the 8 week course students will be introduced to the Elements and Principles of Art and will learn how to recognize and utilize the elements in their projects.

Students will also be learning about glazing and painting tiles. Well thought out forms, designs and functional uses, along with good craftsmanship will also be emphasized. There will be no pottery wheel machine in this class.

### **Course Format**

This course takes place completely on campus in the classroom. To complete this course successfully, students need to attend classes regularly, complete, and submit all assignments by their due date.

### **Course Structure**

This course will consist of hand building projects that must be completed for a final grade. Class lectures will be held in class and will go over information needed to create a finished project. In class lectures will also consist of ceramic terms, techniques, and styles which can be used when completing projects to meet the needs of the specific project criteria.

### Duration

The class will run a total of 8 instructional weeks.

### **Grading**

The student should obtain 70 percent of the grade to successfully complete the ceramics program. The following table summarizes the requirements and grading for this course. The specific instructions for each project are included in the appropriate project outline. Course Content

3	Set of 4 Mugs Using 1/2 lb. of clay per piece, students will use their hands to create a set of 4 mugs. Here students will use pin tools, roller, fettling knife, and sponges to complete this task.	7	Student Choice  • For this project the student will use their knowledge from previous projects to decide on something unique to create using their own creativity. They will still use their hands to create the project.
4	Set of 4 Cups  Using 1/2 lb. of clay per piece, students will use their hands to create a set of 4 mugs.
