Millennium's Perspectives for Higher Education Internationalization

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Abstract

Higher education internationalization and globalization is defined as the process of integrating international, intercultural, and global dimensions into the purpose, functions, quality, or delivery of postsecondary education. Even though, its concept started in the 19th century, it has extensively developed during the 20th century as well. In fact, it has moved from a simple and marginal activity to a constructive reform agenda. The requirements and directions for new educational systems have also been tailored toward the e-learning and distance learning tools, and knowledge-based economy perspectives.

Practically, internationalization of higher education is "the process of commercializing research and postsecondary education, and international competition for the recruitment of foreign students from wealthy and privileged countries in order to generate revenue, secure national profile, and build international reputation". Therefore, the keys for this process practically include recruitment of international students, development of international and virtual branch campuses, private sector involvement, public-private partnerships, students, staff and scholars exchange programs or mobility, curriculum internationalization, research and education partnerships between institutions regionally and internationally, remote international conferences and academic activities, and integrated global projects.

This article will address the sequential development of higher education internationalization process, approaches in terms of activities, competency, ethos and process, main factors of international tertiary education and its developed policies, challenges for the future in this domain, social, academic, and economic impacts, COVID-19 pandemic effect, global trends, and millennium's requirements for learning and educational systems.

Shortcut perspectives of higher education internationalization suitable for the millennium will be highlighted. These perspectives are anticipated to overcome the challenges, adapt the new technologies, and change the higher education internationalization process into opportunity.

Internationalization of Higher Education

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Abstract

Internationalization of higher education is an inevitable process in the era of globalization and a deliberate strategy for improving quality and relevance. Internationalization of higher education is the intentional process of integrating an international, intercultural or global dimension into the purpose, functions and delivery of post-secondary education, in order to enhance the quality of education and research for all students and staff, and to make a meaningful contribution to society.

Although globalization and internationalization are by no mean synonyms, they are interrelated and the factors affecting globalization are also affecting internationalization and some of the criticisms of internationalization are similar to those of globalization. It is of the utmost importance to distinguish the two phenomena and have a clear understanding of what is meant by internationalization of higher education.

Internationalization and global cooperation remain fundamental in today's world. The major challenges to today's world, also documented in Agenda 2030 and the sustainable development goals, including pandemic, climate change, migration, food security, energy resources, waste management, peace and justice, are global in nature and solutions can be found only at global level.

Internationalization of Higher Education: Institutional Policy and the Management of Internationalization

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Abstract

The internationalization of higher education can be considered as a process that links to the world context, in a strategic and planned way, the dimensions that define higher education institutions. This implies that the policies for teaching, research and social bonding programs of these institutions must be grounded in reality and in the global context. However, the global realities are not the same because the problems and the solutions adopted to solve them differ according to the different social, local, and regional contexts. It is true that universities are central institutions for facing complex contemporary challenges and for building fairer, egalitarian and, consequently, more sustainable futures for the planet and humanity. Mobility and Internationalization: Experiences of Pathways to Higher Education Institutions (HEI) from Countries with Scarce Resources

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Abstract

The present work examines the process of internationalization of higher education, based on the experiences of the Pedagogical University of Maputo. It seeks to emphasize that the internationalization process is conditioned by the need to develop an internationalization policy that has as its essential foundations the gains from mobility practices in progress. From the critical analysis of documents, it is possible to understand that mobility practices (of teachers, students, and staff) present oscillating scenarios, due to pandemic, financial and linguistic factors. With these factors, internationalization is a reflection of the specificity of the higher education subsystem, the fragility of state sponsorship and funding, which condition the institutional capacity to bet on strategic internationalization plans.

Internationalization of Higher Education in Cambodia: The Case of Paragon University

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Abstract

Paragon International University (formerly known as Zaman University) was established in 2010 in Phnom Penh, Cambodia. Despite its short history, the university has grown to become a leading and renowned higher education institution in Cambodia. With staff from diverse national backgrounds and English being the medium of instruction, the university is growing steadily and has enrolled over 1,000 students and counting. This presentation will discuss the prospects and challenges of internationalization that Paragon International University has encountered. Data from interviews with the university's administration, staff and students are utilized to understand the rationale for why the university chooses to emphasize certain internationalization aspects (such as international staff recruitment and building international partnership) and how students perceive such trends. The case of Paragon International University can offer insights about the opportunities and challenges of internationalization of higher education in the context of a developing country like Cambodia.

The Internationalization of Epoka University in Albania: Historical, Structural, Cultural, Administrative and Academic Aspects

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Abstract

It has been argued that Albania is a country that continues to undergo a slow and extended transition away from its Communist past, a process that began circa 1990 and has yet to be completed. This slow process has impacted the field of higher education which has undertaken internationalization at a slower pace than other Balkan countries. Epoka University, which began to operate in 2007, has proven to be an exception in this regard. In many ways, Epoka is an example of a 'Born Global' university, with characteristics of a Born Global firm from the business literature. Its internationalization process began at its creation but has moved ever faster in the post-2017 period. This paper will seek to address four issues of this internationalization. First, it will document the historical process of internationalization of Epoka University as a 'Born Global' university. Second, it will examine the structural features of Albanian higher education that permitted internationalization. Third, the paper will look at changes in culture, both in Albania and within Epoka that facilitated internationalization. Fourth, the paper looks at administrative and academic changes inside of Epoka that pushed internationalization forward in recent years. The paper concludes with a discussion of Epoka's future internationalization goals.

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Abstract

The theme aims to share the experience of the Universidad Evangelica de El Salvador (UEES) from a multidisciplinary analysis, addressing the opportunities and challenges to move ahead to the "New Normalcy" in the face of the Corona virus pandemic and the prospects for the future of higher education in its national, regional and global dimension, in the digital age. The transcendental changes applied in the strategic planning are exposed, according to innovative projects in line with United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), Union of Latin American and Caribbean Universities (UDUAL), Community of Latin American and the Caribbean States (CELAC), United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals 2030 agenda, and Government of El Salvador's Laws, Policies, and Agendas related to the subject; evaluating the scientific, technological and structural capacity, to respond to the expectations of the new generations, prioritizing a relevant and quality service, with a solid formation in values. The University advances responding to new challenges from a systemic approach and with scope in the short, medium, and long term, managing change in a timely manner, being a Higher Education Institution that contributes to social transformation consistent with its mission.

The European University of Tirana - Fostering Internationalization After the Pandemic

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Abstract

The presentation will aim at discussing scholarly needs and trends in the process of internationalization of the European University of Tirana (EUT), and its preparedness after the pandemic. It will explain the audience how EUT is embedding approaches and structures to foster internationalization, and the steps it has taken, by focusing on a) extending the academic offer, by licensing study programs in English; b) Improving and facilitating procedures to admit foreign students, especially from the region and even wider, to improve the system of registration; c) quality assurance and enhancing quality for the university through the cooperation with international agencies for institutional accreditation and/or review; d) publication in Scopus Elsevier or Clarivate Analytics (Web of Science), with impact factor, thus increasing the research interest of lecturers and professors; e) increasing expertise and operational capacity for projects development and partnerships; and f) Increasing scientific capabilities with international partners.

As the coronavirus pandemic encircled our globe, universities everywhere experienced the same shock. ETU realized that its scientific and technological capabilities, seemed to be insufficient to do more than "Stem the growing loss of life". The pandemic also revealed how inadequate scientific and technological education was among the public and among the world's leaders. Next, it revealed the limits of international cooperation, despite the vast potential of available technological means. Universities must set the tone and persuade the public, their students, and society of the advantages of international cooperation on both, educational and scientific fronts.

Providing Quality Assurance Support to Teaching and Learning Services Remotely at Suleyman Demirel University (Kazakhstan)

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Abstract

Quality assurance in teaching and learning is one of the key priorities for the senior leadership team in the higher education system. It provides minimal standards and requirements for academic staff in delivering the courses, and useful guidance and instructions for the students on learning autonomously. However, external factors such as COVID-19 and subsequent social distance restrictions cause challenges to educational institutions where the essential part of teaching and learning is supposed to be carried out in person. At this point, the Academic Council (AC) of Suleyman Demirel University (SDU) in collaboration with academic staff and students worked out some guidelines for the remote teaching and learning and made some changes to an academic policy as well. This paper reports on the overall quality assurance system and support to teaching and learning services remotely at SDU during the COVID-19 period. The quality assurance support in teaching and learning remotely can be presented briefly under seven set of tools that help the Faculty Management Board to support academic staff in teaching and learning services. These tools can be adopted by any other institutions for the quality assurance purposes.

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Abstract

An exchange program is a program in which a young person goes on a trip in a more or less supervised environment. It is also called a student exchange program if a program is aimed at students. Student mobility or studying at universities other than the institution at which the student originally matriculated, was for a long time an important element in a fully-rounded academic education. Today, the mobility of students and staff is a growing phenomenon in higher education activity around the world. Study in another cultural, geographic, and linguistic context offers a tremendous wealth of potential areas for research. The number of university students participating in exchange programs has risen sharply over the last decade. A survey of Swiss university graduates (classes of 1999 and 2001) shows that participation in student exchange programs depends significantly on the socio-economic background of students. This paper talks about the experience of IT business school in student exchange programs. Are Student Exchange Programs worth it?

Emerging Ethical Issues in Higher Education

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Abstract

Morality and ethics are social constructs which guide individuals to do the right things for the right reasons. In comparison with laws, ethical codes are more persuasive than compelling. These codes adjust themselves to the needs of the society. For an example in the prehistoric ages physical strength was very important but in the current times mental capability fetches the highest pay! As times change, the definition of vices and virtues shifts. This shift however may or may not be for the betterment of the humanity as a whole. Thus, a conscious and careful teaching of moral and ethical values needs to be integrated in the system of higher education. Feasibility of Lean Implementation of Teaching Process at Higher Education Institutions

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Abstract

Kyrgyz education has evolved towards the leading education systems after the Soviet Union collapse. It is suffering from lack of continuity, leadership, process approach, continuous improvement, data-driven decision making, and proper funding of the adopted state programs. It is assumed that a 'lean approach' can serve as a solution for improving the weaknesses mentioned above. Lean teaching can apply not only to classroom teaching, but also to online teaching as well. In this study, it is proposed to figure out possible positive effects and challenges of lean implementation on the teaching process in leading Western countries. After having comprehensive understanding about good practices and barriers upon literature review, the intent is to conduct an empirical study in Kyrgyzstan to learn whether a lean approach will have a significant effect on the teaching process. This study talks about how successful implementation of a Lean Approach at Ala-Too International University (AIU) will convince other Kyrgyz institutions to adopt it and eventually change the overall education system.

Main objectives to be achieved by the end of the study are first, revise course syllabi for two AIU engineering courses to reflect key features of Lean Approach; and second, interview teachers about feasibility of implementing the approach (time, resources, perceptions of effectiveness). The methodology will be designed and based on the following hypothesis: Much awareness of instructors (and/or senior managers of divisions) about lean principles is most likely to affect students' success during a teaching process. The objectives will be accomplished through three stages as mentioned before. Parallel to literature review, a certain number of lecturers at higher education institutions will be interviewed to determine their level of knowledge about lean teaching. Then, observational studies may also be conducted in lectures to identify and examine the status of lean teaching in a process. As a last step of the first stage, two syllabi for Industrial Engineering courses will be revised reflecting key features of lean teaching principles. In continuation to this stage at AIU, two revised courses syllabi will be implemented, and seminars will be organized for volunteer lecturers among the Engineering and Informatics faculty. There are going to be two groups of lecturers and their students: control group and treatment group. Students will be categorized into three levels as well: low level, medium level, and high level. Then, there is going to be a semester bound experiment for at least two syllabi revised courses.

Linking between Cloud Computing Applications, Learn & Grow, Internal Process and Students' Satisfaction

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Abstract

The study seeks to define the linking between cloud computing applications, learn & grow, internal process and students' satisfaction. The research sample comprised of 260 supervisory academic and administrative from Jordanian private universities (JPU). To achieve research purpose, questionnaire was used to measure the cloud computing applications impact on learn & grow, internal process and students' satisfaction. The study concluded that there was a high using level of cloud computing applications, and that the same applies to the level of learn & grow, internal process and students satisfaction. In addition, there was a statistically significant correlation between cloud computing applications and learn & grow, internal process and students' satisfaction. In light of the aforementioned results, the recommendations are discussed.

Innovative Solutions of Learning Applications Based on Cloud System Quality, Information Quality and Service Quality on Universities' Performance

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Abstract

Innovative solutions of learning applications based on cloud system have been identified as a critical issue in universities' performance, little research has focused on the relationship between innovative solutions of learning applications based on cloud system quality, information quality, service quality and universities' performance. Drawing on resource based view theory, this research aims to examine the impact of innovative solutions of learning applications based on cloud system quality, information quality, service quality on universities' performance in Jordanian institutions of higher education. The study's sample includes (420) academic professors at four universities. The proposed model gets tested in both public and private universities in Jordan's northern region, using the structural equation modelling (SEM) to analyze the data. According to the findings, innovative solutions of learning applications based on cloud system quality, information quality, service quality positively impacts on universities' performance. Theoretical and practical implications are discussed.
