DEGREE CONCENTRATIONS


The Business Administration program focuses on three areas of specialization:

FINANCE: Prepares students to specialize in different aspects of finance including business finance, investments, financial analysis and valuation, international finance, and financial management.

Graduates typically work in banks or similar financial institutions, manufacturing and retail firms, service industries and the public sector are environments for graduates. The department offers special support for students who would like to become a Certified Financial Analyst.

The Association for Computing Machinery (ACM) is the world's largest educational and scientific computing society, which uses resources that advance computing as a science and a profession.




ELEMENTARY EDUCATION


The TCP offers teacher certification in the following areas: Mathematics (7-12), Social Studies (7-12), English Language Arts/Reading (7-12).





M.ED. IN CURRICULUM & INSTRUCTION

Our Master of Education in Curriculum & Instruction is designed to:

- give students a sound foundational knowledge of human development, learning environments, and cognitive and behavioral models.
- equip students with the skills to develop curricula and design/deliver superior instruction using technology.
- provide knowledge of current educational research to help students develop pedagogical content and subject matter knowledge in STEM fields.
- prepare students to design project-based learning experiences and develop a framework for thinking about the role of STEM subjects in all aspects of the society.

M.ED. IN SCHOOL COUNSELING

The Master of Education in School Counseling is a non-thesis, 36 hour credit, and 100% online program including an internship for graduation. It is designed to develop counseling skills and school counselor preparation for individuals who are seeking a graduate degree in school counseling.

Coursework features individual and group counseling theories to help, support, and advocate for all students, applying research for data-driven decisions, research methods in support of school counseling programs, legal issues and ethical principles, and developing the design implementation, management, and evaluation of a comprehensive developmental school counseling program.

M.ED. IN EDUCATIONAL LEADERSHIP

North American University's Master of Education in Educational Leadership program prepares students to assume positions in public school leadership and administration, and is designed to meet the needs of students seeking to develop the knowledge, skills, and dispositions essential to becoming effective educational leaders.

Masters of Education in Educational Leadership (EDLE) students will become ready for state principal certification once they complete their degrees. CUIN master program students can be eligible for principal certification by taking 7 EDLE area courses.

In addition to improving your English skills, the academically demanding IEP courses are academically demanding courses specifically designed to prepare you to study effectively and thoroughly at the university. In order for the IEP program to provide an intensive, fast-track route to university placement, your English classes meet five days a week for a minimum of four hours a day.

CAREER SERVICES MISSION & VISION

The Office of Career & Success Services is dedicated to providing undergraduate, graduate and alumni with the necessary tools and resources to bridge the academic experience with a successful career path. Existing students and alumni have the opportunity to participate in year-round events such as:

STUDENT SUCCESS CENTER

North American University offers an array of student success services. Tutoring is offered on a daily basis in the Success Center from 8 A.M.-7:00 P.M. all undergraduate subjects. Tutors may offer an array of services throughout the semester ranging from an academic workshop or a Tutor talent show.

The Peer Mentor Program works closely with all new incoming freshmen students. The program supplements the freshmen seminar and acts as a liaison for all incoming freshmen students. Several activities and events are planned throughout the semester which include, weekly mentoring sessions, adviser meetings, networking events and one off campus event.

Academic workshops are offered throughout the semester. Typically there are 4 scheduled workshops each semester. They are designed to provide students an opportunity to receive tips and strategies to boost their academic confidence.

The student success center offers disability accommodations. Any student that has a disability may complete the disability accommodation form with the appropriate medical documentation. The Success Center ensures that the student receives the appropriate accommodation as determined.

As of Fall 2016, the success center implemented a new program, "Earning through learning", which allows students to earn points each time they receive a tutoring session. Once they achieve a certain number of points they can exchange their card in for free NAU gear.a We have had over 200 students receive tutoring on campus.


