THE INTENSIVE ENGLISH PROGRAM (IEP)

The Gulf Language School's (GLS) Intensive English Program is designed to improve your English skills and provide a pathway to pursue a Bachelor or Master's Degree program at university. The courses aim to improve the language, study, and critical thinking skills of each student. IEP has a unique curriculum that prepares students for success in a university's academic environment.

In addition to improving your English skills, the IEP courses are academically demanding courses specifically designed to prepare you to study effectively and thoroughly at an undergraduate degree level In order for the IEP program to provide an intensive, fast-track route to university placement, your English classes meet five days a week for a minimum of four hours a day.

MEDICAL ENGLISH COURSE

Gulf Language School at North American University offers international medical professionals an opportunity to improve their English during weekday and weekend classes, in 16-week sessions. This course is designed to help students communicate more effectively and confidently in English. The course addresses improvement in oral skills needed for healthcare situations.

Students also have opportunities to develop their medical field vocabulary, writing and grammar skills. In addition, pariticipants will practice pronunciation and doctor-patient interactions through pair and group exercises. This course is limited to students whose first language is not English.

ACHIEVE PROFICIENCY IN ENGLISH

IEP LEVELS

LOWER BEGINNING ENGLISH

(LEVEL 1)

Basic grammatical structures, vocabulary, writing sentences and beginning paragraphs, academic reading, listening and conversation

UPPER BEGINNING ENGLISH (LEVEL 2)

High-beginner grammatical structures, vocabulary extension, writing paragraphs with compound sentences, academic reading, listening and everyday conversation

LOWER INTERMEDIATE ENGLISH (LEVEL 3)

Complex grammatical structures and vocabulary, writing paragraphs progressing to essays, academic reading, listening and extended conversation.

UPPER INTERMEDIATE ENGLISH (LEVEL 4)

Advanced grammatical structures and vocabulary, writing essays, academic reading, listening and high-intermediate conversation

LOWER ADVANCED ENGLISH (LEVEL 5)

Academic vocabulary and reading, writing essays progressing to research papers, listening and advanced conversation skills

UPPER ADVANCED ENGLISH (1 FVF1 6)

U.S. College/University preparation skills including: academic reading, writing research papers, listening (note-taking and study skills), debate, discourse and public speaking

INTERMEDIATE TOEFL PREPARATION

This course prepares students to achieve their desired score on the TOEFL. The curriculum includes in-depth analysis and practice of the various, question types, tips on how to answer test questions, partial and full-length tests.

ADVANCED TOEFL PREPARATION

This course deals with two aspects of standardized tests, preparation and test-taking strategies. Focuses on the primary target, with examples, analyses, practice tests, timing, and computer- and internet-based sessions.

DEVELOPMENTAL READING & WRITING

This course surveys a variety of reading materials. Students will learn to locate explicit textual information, draw complex inferences, and describe, analyze, and evaluate the information within the across multiple texts of varying lengths. This course explores a variety of writing modalities specific to college-level assignments. Students will generate ideas and gather information relevant to the topic and purpose, incorporating the ideas and words of other writers in student writing using established strategies.
